

## Recycling Continued

**NOTE:** Discard all caps (plastic & metal).  
**NO** Styrofoam products. **NO** Window glass or drinking glasses. **NO** motor oil/antifreeze containers. **NO** pesticide or spray paint containers. **NO** 5-gallon pails. **NO** lawn furniture. **NO** plastic flower pots.

PAPER PRODUCTS and CONTAINER items **must** be separate. More than one container is beneficial. You may purchase additional Blue Boxes at the Village Hall for \$7.50.

For household hazardous waste disposal call Ontario County Recycling at 585-526-4420.



### Special Note:

As a Victor Resident you always have the option of taking these items to the Town Recycling Center, located at 60 Rawson Road, after obtaining a free permit and sticker.

Permits and stickers are available at the Town Clerk's Office, 85 East Main Street, during regular business hours. Hours are Monday—Friday 9am to 4:30pm and Wednesdays until 7pm.

## Solid Waste Collection:

Solid Waste (garbage, rubbish, & recyclables) is collected on a weekly basis.

Garbage, rubbish, and recyclables:

- Must be placed at curbside
- Garbage and rubbish must be placed in heavyweight **CLEAR** plastic bags, per Ontario County
- **No one bag or receptacle shall exceed 75 pounds total weight when filled.**
- **Total collection volume not to exceed 100-gallons capacity.**
- **Village Code limits three 32-gallon approved containers per property, per week**
- Improperly bagged or prepared solid waste of any kind or that is frozen to the receptacles or which is infested with insects will not be collected
- All large items such as appliances, furniture, bicycles, sleds, toys, tires, building materials, rugs, etc., will be collected from the curb area only on scheduled days twice a year (See Large Trash Pickup Brochure)

## Ontario County Recycling in the Village of

### Victor:

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD (look for ridges):

Flatten and reduce to 2' X 4' and place under blue recycle box. No food or oil-stained cardboard, such as pizza boxes. No waxy or glossy surfaces.

### PAPER BAGS:

Brown Grocery, white & colored—Put with corrugated cardboard.

### PAPER PRODUCTS:

Office paper, Magazines, Catalogs, Junk Mail, Telephone Books, Newspapers and Inserts, \*Boxboard/Paperboard, Glossy paper, Construction & Composition paper, File Folders, Non-metallic gift wrap, and Fax paper—Combine and place in blue box or in paper grocery bags. NOTE: Shredded office paper must be in clear plastic bags.

\*Boxboard/Paperboard: All boxes that are not corrugated such as cereal, shoe, gift, cracker, cake mixes, and facial tissue. These should be flattened and any lining removed.

### THE FOLLOWING PAPER PRODUCTS ARE UNACCEPTABLE FOR RECYCLING:

Waxed paper, glossy or waxy paper bags, egg cartons, waxed paperboards such as milk cartons or juice boxes, paper plates & cups, food-contaminated papers, tissue paper, metallic gift wrap, carbon paper, toilet paper and paper towels.

### CONTAINERS:

Clear & Colored Glass Bottles & Jars; Metal & Bi-metal cans; Plastics #1-7; empty Aerosol Containers from beauty and household products only & License Plates (defaced—by painting over or cut in half). Rinse all Containers well to remove food or liquid residue. Place sharp metal can lids inside the cans. Flatten cans and Plastic jugs. Combine and place in blue box.
