DESIGNATION FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR FUNDING IN THE MODOCK SPRINGS VALUE PROTECTION PLAN

On motion of Councilman Accorso, seconded by Councilman Palomaki, the following resolution was

WHEREAS, the Town Board adopted the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan on July 14, 2008 by Resolution # 259, and resolved to immediately examine all lawful means to implement the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan, in whole or in part, including sources for funding from State and/or Federal agencies and other strategies to provide remedies recommended in the Plan; and

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2008, the Town received a verbal commitment for \$1.1 million in funding for the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan from Syracuse Sand and Gravel, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), and the State of New York through Senator Michael Nozzolio; and,

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Modock Springs Citizen's Advisory Committee (MSCAC) to define the homes eligible to receive funding through the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Modock Springs Citizen's Advisory Committee has submitted a list of fifty-nine (59) homes eligible to receive funding through the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan designated as "Schedule A" and kept in the subject file in the Town Clerk's Office; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board approves the fifty-nine (59) homes eligible for funding through the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan designated as Schedule A" and kept in the subject file in the Town Clerk's office as recommended by the Modock Springs Citizen's Advisory Committee; and further

RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the property owners of the fifty-nine (59) homes listed eligible to receive funding through the Modock Springs Value Protection Plan, Michael Annechino, Chairperson of the Modock Springs Citizen's Advisory; Paul Lytle, Councilman John Accorso, and Michael Dollard, Chief Accountant.
