A regular meeting of the Victor Town Board was held on February 27, 2023, starting at 7:00 PM in the Main Meeting Room of the Victor Town Hall.

Public Comments or Concerns:

Randy Shea, 50 West Main Street

Mr. Shea explained why he feels the abandonment and removal of the rail spur that services Victor Insulators Inc. would be a gigantic mistake for the town, county and for our nation and he referenced his Youtube video on this topic. Mr. Shea has several reasons against the abandonment, but the main reason is jobs (green jobs, union jobs, local jobs). Another is living history; this is where the wet porcelain insulator was first designed and manufactured by Fred Locke in the 1800s. Mr. Shea noted this is one of the last two insulator plants in North America. The implications of the rails possibly being taken up should be known to the residents prior to the decision. The Ontario County Central Railroad Corporation has filed a notice of intent to partially terminate abandoned service that connects the spur serving Victor Insulator Inc. The Surface Transportation Board is open to receiving public comments pertaining to this filing by March 24, 2023. Friends of the Railroad.org has information on this. Mr. Shea is hoping the Town Board will speak for keeping the rails, but whatever the position he hopes it will be spoken publicly. This has nothing to do with the rail going to State Route 251.

Diane Robbins, 644 Championship Drive

Ms. Robbins is also in support of Victor Insulators. She feels the Town jumped ahead of the Surface Transportation Board. She handed out copies of the letter she wrote to the Department of Transportation. She also feels, as does Mr. Shea, that this is a national security issue and does not want to depend on China for the insulators for the electrical grid.

Dolores Fanton, 8082 Taylor Road

Councilman Condon told Ms. Fanton that the board received her memo. Her concerns are related to the Strong Road development. She handed out copies given to her by the assessor on the most recent conservation easements. Ms. Fanton questioned the types of easements on the map. She noted it didn't seem the residents' concerns were being taken into consideration. She also discussed that certain properties had deed restrictions and that the proposed subdivision wouldn't fit the character of the neighborhood. She asked if the board had any suggestions as to what else she could do.

Councilman Condon agreed that conservation easements are complicated and the town is constantly working with residents on the restrictions of their easements. He explained Supervisor Marren is at a conference and he will reply to Ms. Fanton's letter and may have some suggestions for her.

WHEREAS, the Town Board approved the receipt of the final awarded amount of \$633,485.27 bringing the total awarded amount received to \$1,266,970.55 from the Federal government associated with the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund per Resolution No. 211, dated July 25, 2022; and

WHEREAS, in guidance issued by the NYS Comptroller June 2021, the NYS Comptroller classified these funds as non-recurring revenues which are not repeatedly received by local governments and directed local governments to submit a budget amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board understands funds can generally be used to cover permissible costs that were incurred after March 3, 2021, and the deadline to obligate funds is December 31, 2024, and the deadline to spend funds is December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board understands the monies may be used for the following categories:

- To respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency or its negative economic impacts;
- To provide premium pay to essential workers;
- To cover loss of revenue to provide government services;
- To make necessary investments in building improvements, water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Town Finance Director created Capital Project (ARPA) for accounting of ARPA revenues and expenditures separate from the Town's annual budget; and

WHEREAS, funds need to be appropriated in the 2022 Budget to reflect the revenue and expense items for the current year as indicated below:

SEQR: Harlan Fisher Park, Dog Park Construction

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Victor (the "Town Board") adopted the Town of Victor Parks and Recreation Master Plan Update (the "Master Plan") on August 26, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board intends to move forward with implementation of Priority Project 3 identified in the Master Plan, specifically, construction of a Dog Park at Harlan Fisher Park (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project consists of three (3) phases, including development of a dog park area on the north end of the park, park entrance improvements, including replacement of the existing parking area with a new parking surface, installation of pathways, installation of park furnishings including benches and picnic tables, all of which are more fully described in Part I of the Environmental Assessment Form; and

WHEREAS, the Project can be classified as an Unlisted Action, as the Project does not fit within the list of Type I or Type II actions identified in Sections 617.4 and 617.5 of the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") regulations; and

WHEREAS, the SEQRA review and subsequent Negative Declaration (Resolution 301 of 2019) associated with the adoption of the 2019 Master Plan excluded and segmented projects or physical activities, including construction associated with projects identified in the Master Plan, as incomplete information was available or uncertainties existed related to design of such projects; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board caused to be prepared Part 1 of the Short Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF") for the Project in accordance with SEQRA, and also caused to be prepared Parts 2 and 3 of the EAF; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has conducted a careful review of the potential adverse environmental impacts associated with the construction of the proposed Project, including review of Parts 2 and 3 of the EAF, and attachments thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that no potential significant adverse environmental impacts were identified with the proposed Project using the criteria for determining significance identified in 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c)(1) and in accordance with 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c)(2) and (3), and the Town Board hereby finds and concludes that the proposed Project will not present a potential significant adverse environmental impact and hereby issues a Negative Declaration; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, A Notice of Negative Declaration shall be filed and/or published to the extent required by the SEQRA regulations, this resolution has been prepared in accordance with Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation Act.

AUTHORIZATION TO SEEK BIDS FOR DRYER ROAD PARK AND VICTOR MUNICIPAL PARK –
PARKING LOT RENOVATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Town Board has recommended that the Director of Parks and Recreation and Town Engineer develop a plan for parking area improvements at Dryer Road Park and Victor Municipal Park to increase the parking capacity at each park while promoting public safety and the enjoyment of these spaces; and

WHEREAS, federal funding is available for the project from the Town's allocation through the American Rescue Plan (A.7110.400 ARP); and

WHEREAS, the Director of Parks and Recreation presented the preliminary design and scope of the plans to the Parks and Recreation Citizens' Advisory Committee and Town Board in July and August, 2022; and

WHEREAS, revisions have been made to the plan based on these comments as well as comments from the Department of Parks and Recreation staff, the Town Board, and the Director of Finance; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Parks and Recreation has the need to hire a contractor to complete construction of portions of the project including earthwork, drainage, pavement subsurface, asphalt paving, asphalt striping and site lighting based on the designs, drawings, specifications and opinion of probable costs from the Town Engineer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Town Board authorizes the Director of Parks and Recreation and Town Engineer to seek bids for the Town of Victor Parking Lot Renovation Project for Dryer Road Park and Victor Municipal Park, and further

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Director of Parks and Recreation, Project Engineer LaBella Associates, Director of Finance, and Town Clerk.

RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Director of Parks and Recreation, John Belyea, Project Engineer LaBella Associates, and Town Clerk.
