Given the sensitive data, valuable materials, and environmentally hazardous substances that may be found inside your electronics, how you recycle and dispose of your electronic waste is critical.

EWASTE+ understands your risks and your concern...We can help you dispose of electronics in a manner that's secure, safe, environmentally responsible and in compliance with government laws and regulations. We have an EWaste+ Alliance Network of 175 residential collection sites as a convenient drop off option, all are registered with the DEC. Please go on our website at www.ewaste.com and click on the "Drop off" button on the top right hand corner, then type in your zip code to find the nearest location.

Attention Residential Customers: There will be a nominal handling fee for ALL televisions, monitors and microwaves dropped off for recycling at the EWASTE+ facility at 7318 Victor-Mendon Rd in Victor, NY.

Nominal Handling Fees Applicable to EWASTE+ Location Only:

Microwaves - \$5

Flat Panel Monitors - \$20

Flat Panel Televisions - \$20

CRT Monitors - \$20

CRT Televisions 27" and smaller - \$20

CRT Televisions larger than 27" - \$40*

*Also includes DLP, Rear Projection, and Wood Console

Common Questions and Answers

Q: Is it legal to charge consumers for recycling in New York State?

A: Yes - It is legal for collection sites and recyclers to charge consumers for recycling however the manufacturers cannot take credit for pounds that consumers pay for (manufacturers have volume requirements per law).

Q: Where Can I take my Televisions & Monitors for free recycling?

A: You can go to the NYS DEC website below and identify the specific brand of video display you have and research the free program that specific manufacturers offer in NYS.

Q: I used to be able to recycle my TVs and Monitors for free at EWASTE+, why is there a cost now?

A: The cost associated with proper recycling of televisions and monitors exceeds the funding received under the New York State Electronics Recycling & Reuse Act (EPR Law). After several years of EWASTE+ subsidizing the costs of proper video display recycling, it is now necessary for EWASTE+ to directly charge a small fee to properly handle and recycle TV's and Monitors.
